- Make policy for retailers, manufacturers or food safety certification programme owners (CPOs).
- Undertake any accreditation or certification activities.
- Own any food safety programmes or standards, or undertake training.
- Have any involvement outside the scope of food safety, such as animal welfare, the environment or ethical sourcing.

GFSI Strategy


The purpose of the GFSI is:

- a) to help advance food safety worldwide in the interest of building consumer trust and;
- b) to increase efficiency for the industry by eliminating redundancy and improving operational efficiency.

More specifically, its core objectives are:



Harmonising and raising the standards of food safety certification programmes worldwide, by assessing them against regularly updated Benchmarking Requirements. In doing so, we foster mutual acceptance of standards and reduce unnecessary duplication of controls and audits. This also improves global harmonisation and helps reduce trade barriers.



Building food safety capabilities for the industry and its suppliers, through our Global Markets Programme and GFSI Local Group activities. We focus companies who wish to improve their food safety systems, providing guidelines on food safety management systems and a pathway towards full certification. This helps directly increase food safety and has the side benefit of helping smaller companies gain additional market access.



<u>partnering with government food safety regulators and public partners</u>, through dialogue and participation in joint programmes. This contributes to the global harmonisation of food safety regulations and to the reduction of barriers to trade.

Benchmarking and Harmonisation

Benchmarking Requirements

Endorsement of existing CPOs.
Approval, support and authorisation of existing standards by a global body.

- A way that GFSI aims to improve food safety and business efficiency is by **creating a common acceptance** of good food safety requirements.
- The **GFSI Benchmarking Requirements** form the foundation of the GFSI Benchmarking process by which **private standards organisations (certification programme owners) may gain recognition**. Upon completion of the benchmarking process, a scheme is 'recognised' by GFSI when all of its criteria are considered to be equivalent to the requirements set out by GFSI.
- GFSI fosters mutual acceptance within the industry and reduces inefficiencies.
- Given GFSI's global perspective, it is able to improve global harmonisation and reduce trade barriers.
- GFSI recognises certification programmes and does not certify companies.

- In today's interconnected world, multi-stakeholder collaboration is needed to make a difference across global supply chains.
- GFSI's capacity as global convener for food safety collaboration that puts GFSI at the forefront of public-private partnerships.
- GFSI is leading a growing dialogue with regulators and governments (**China, US and Mexico...**) to syndicate the work already accomplished by the private sector and to promote the recognition of independent assessments.
- GFSI has embarked on several pilots and projects for large-scale collaboration for food safety which includes a renewed partnership with the *United Nations Industrial Organization* (*UNIDO*) to launch a far-reaching capability building programme in several key geographies.






